TRANSFERRING FIREARM with William Larkin Moore & Sons LLC, the TRANSFEREE represents that all products TRANSFERRED will be used in a lawful manner and TRANSFEREE are of a legal age, and where applicable, a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident of the U.S., and not prohibited to acquire or use such products. No products TRANSFERRED by William Larkin Moore & Sons LLC will be knowingly shipped or transferred to a person in any jurisdiction where it is unlawful to receive or possess such product. William Larkin Moore & Sons LLC shall have no liability to any customer due to the customer's intentional or unintentional violation of federal, state, or local laws.

MODERN FIREARMS: all modern post-1898 firearms, non-automatic and semi-automatic firearms, hand guns, cartridge rifles with a barrels greater than 16 inches long, or shotguns with a barrels greater than 18 inches long, or either cartridge rifles or shotgun-shell-firing shotguns with an overall length of greater than 26 inches. Provided that federal law and the laws of both the dealer's and purchaser's states and localities are complied with an individual 21 years of age or older may acquire a handgun from a dealer federally licensed to sell firearms in the individual's state of residence. An individual 18 years of age or older may purchase a rifle or shotgun from a federally licensed dealer in any state. However, the applicant may not purchase a pistol gripped long gun that does not have a shoulder stock until he or she is 21 years of age.

C&R: Firearm curios or relics include firearms which have special value to collectors because they possess some qualities not ordinarily associated with firearms intended for sporting use or as offensive or defensive weapons. To be recognized as curios or relics, firearms must fall within one of the following categories: Have been manufactured at least 50 years prior to the current date, but not including replicas thereof; or Be certified by the curator of a municipal, State, or Federal museum which exhibits firearms to be curios or relics of museum interest; or Derive a substantial part of their monetary value from the fact that they are novel, rare, bizarre, or from the fact of their association with some historical figure, period, or event.

ANTIQUE FIREARMS: Under the United States Gun Control Act of 1968, any cartridge firearm made in or before 1898 ("pre-1899") is classified as an "antique", and is generally outside of Federal jurisdictions. The only exceptions to the Federal exemption are antique machineguns and antique cartridge rifles or shotguns firing shotgun shells that are classified as "short barreled". Muzzle loading guns, as replicas of antique guns, are not subject to Federal jurisdiction and are essentially classified the same as an antique firearm. **NO FFL TRANSFER REQUIRED.**
